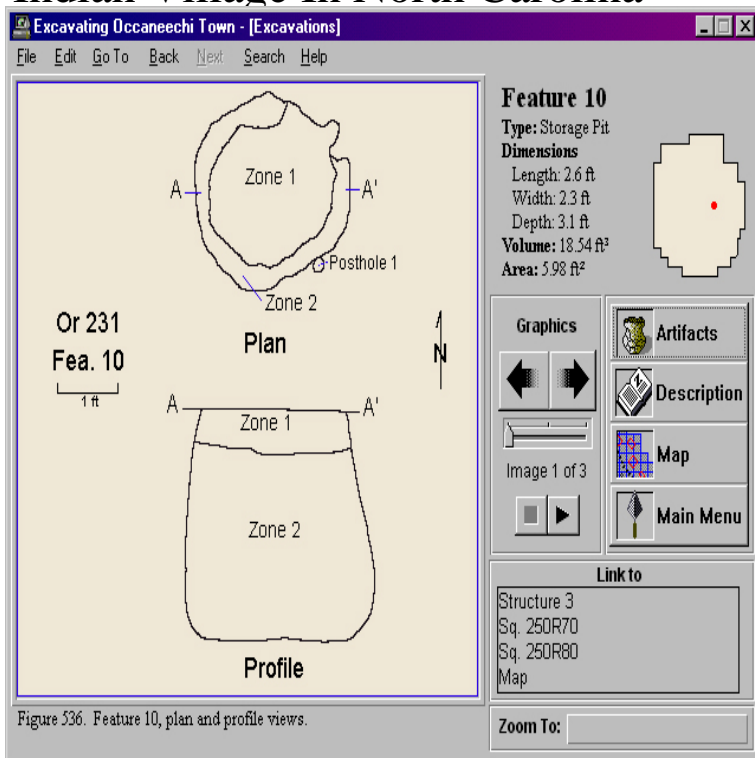


Figure 536. Feature 10, plan and profile views.
