Abstract. In the early years of Mendelism, 1900–1910, William Bateson established a productive research group consisting of women and men studying biology at Cambridge. The empirical evidence they provided through investigating the patterns of heredity in many different species helped confirm the validity of the Mendelian laws of heredity. What has not previously been well recognized is that owing to the lack of sufficient institutional support, the group primarily relied on domestic resources to carry out their work. Members of the group formed a kind of extended family unit, centered on the Batesons’ home in Grantchester and the grounds of Newnham College. This case illustrates the continuing role that domestic environments played in supporting scientific research in the early 20th century.

Newly emerging scientific disciplines in the late 19th century attracted a significant number of women, many of whom were among the first generation to receive a university education in the sciences. These women tended to be active and “visible” until these new fields gained intellectual and institutional legitimacy. This was true, for example, in radioactive physics, biochemistry, and ecology. It was also the case for genetics, as can be seen in the research group William Bateson established at Cambridge University.¹

Margaret Rossiter has explained this phenomenon in terms of economic and sociological forces, noting that because of their marginal status within science, women have frequently colonized nascent fields of
